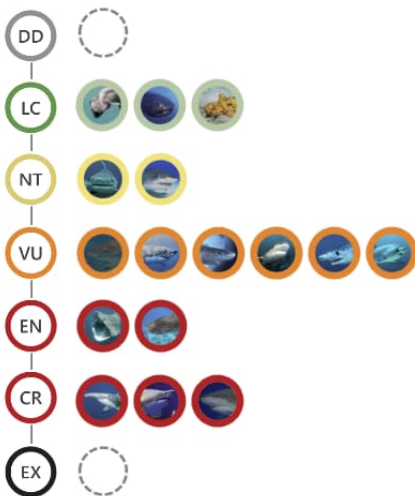

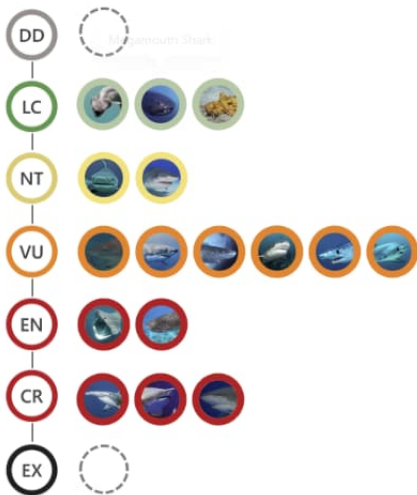
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#2. The Megamouth Shark

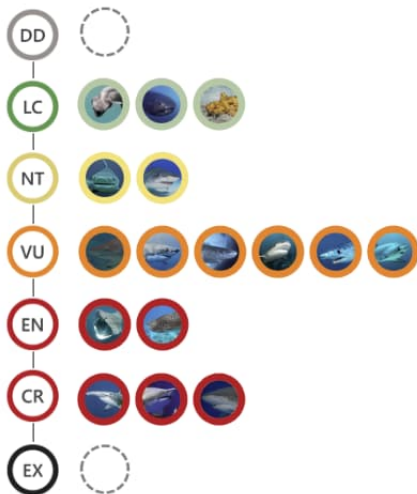
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#3. Wobbegong Shark

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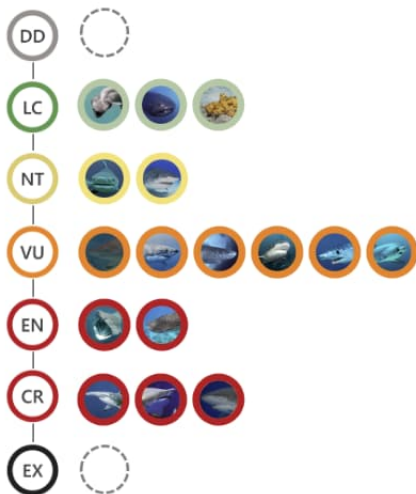

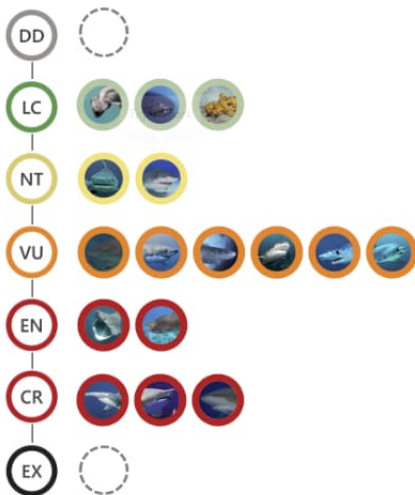
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#5. Tiger Shark

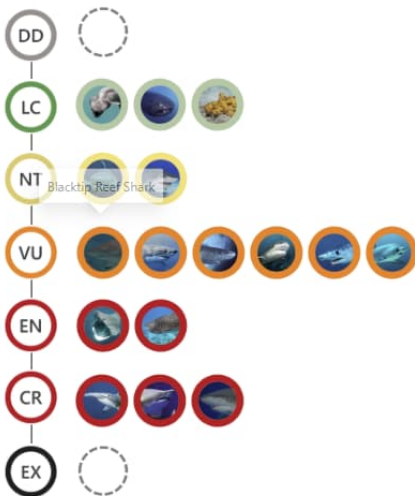

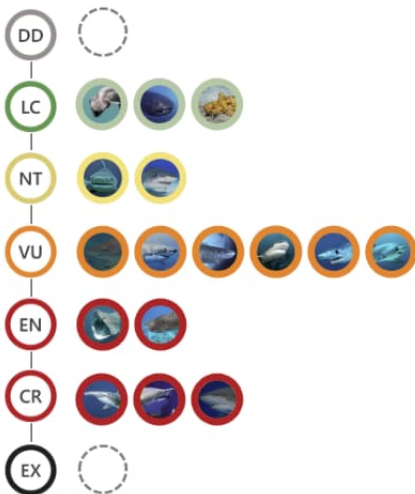

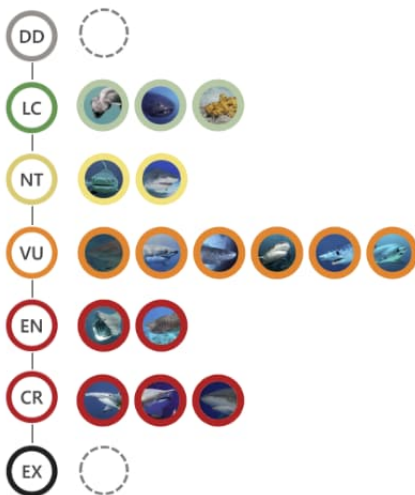
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#8. The Greenland Shark

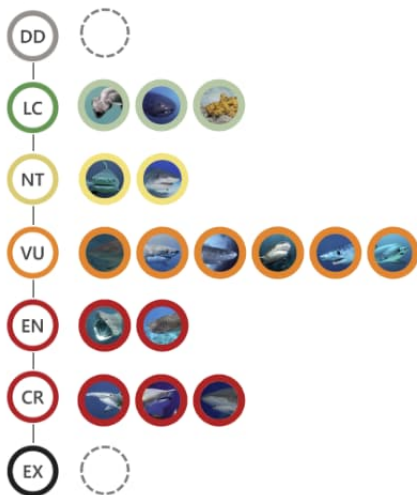

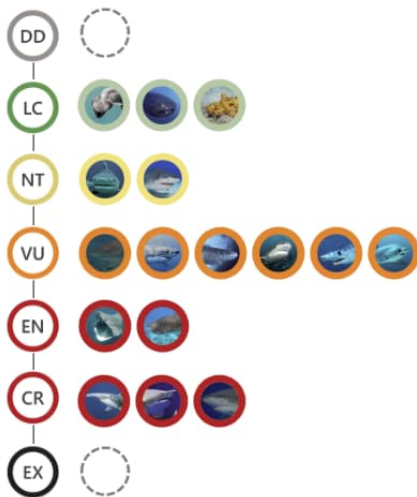

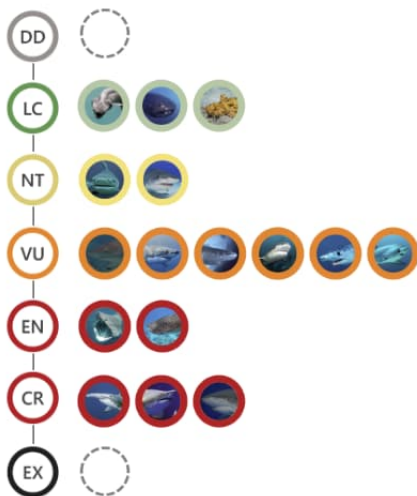
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#11. Thresher Shark

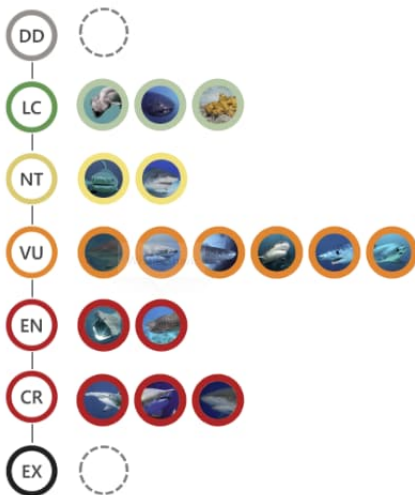

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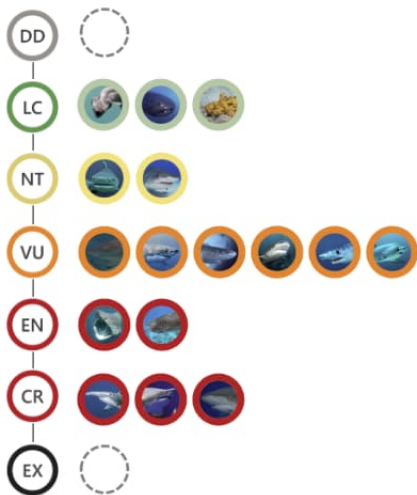

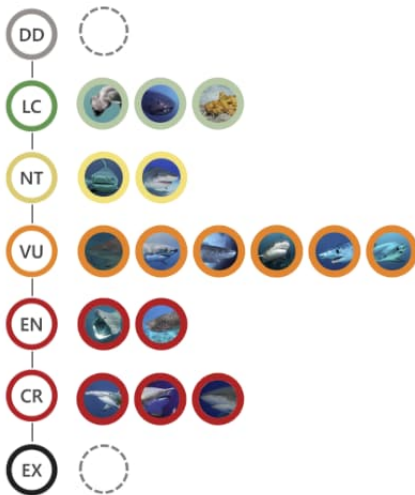
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#16. The Oceanic Whitetip Shark
